


the Apple?

This booklet is part of my Ten Apples Up On Top packet.

Objective: Students will demonstrate understanding of location terms: over, under, in front of, on, beside, and between.

To set up this activity, print off the page of apples (one page per 8 students) and cut the strips into rows. Each student will need six apples to complete the booklet. A page of both colored apples and black-and-white apples have been included.

Materials:

- Booklet (one per student)
- Apple pictures
- Scissors
- Glue sticks


Activity:

- 1. Introduce the activity to students.
- 2. Instruct students to first cut the apples apart. (This can be done ahead of time, if desired.)
- 3. Now, read through each page and glue the apple in the appropriate place.
- 4. Color the rest of the booklet, if desired.

Enrichment Ideas:


- Give students a strip of black-and-white apples and access to green, yellow, and red crayons. Give directions such as:
 - o Color 2 apples red.
 - o Color one more than 3 apples green.
 - o Color the first apple yellow.
 - o Color the apples in an AB pattern.
- Before introducing the booklet, practice location concepts with an actual apple (real or fake) and a basket or tree. Instruct students to place their apples in the following places:
 - o under the table or basket
 - o next to or beside the basket or tree
 - o make the apple go up, then bring it back down
 - o behind them
 - o over their heads
 - o on their noses
 - o between them and the table or between the basket and the tree
 - o in front of them


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
The apple is <u>under</u> the basket.




The apple is <u>under</u> the basket.




The apple is <u>over</u> the trees.
